Location: Springfield, MA

Program Details:

Stewards Individual Placements provides individuals with service and career opportunities to strengthen communities and preserve our natural resources. The Community Volunteer Ambassador (CVA) Program combines the strength of a national leader in conservation service with the National Park Service to train a diverse group of emerging leaders to assist park units in building lasting connections to local communities.

Community Volunteer Ambassadors (CVAs) support Volunteer-in-Parks programs at National Park Service sites nationwide. This ranges from National Park, National Monuments, National Battlefields, National Historic Sites, National Recreation Areas, and more. The Community Volunteer Ambassador Program was developed to support NPS sites in connecting with their local communities through service and to provide young adults with a professional development opportunity within the National Park Service. CVAs provide capacity for NPS sites to establish community partnerships, develop new volunteer opportunities, and build volunteer program resources.

Site Information

Located in Western Massachusetts and Connecticut in the Connecticut River Valley, the sites focus on the global impacts of the second American industrial revolution and precision manufacturing. Our VIP programs have different focuses between Springfield and Hartford.

Position Summary

The Connecticut River Valley is ripe with institutions and people working toward common goals of social justice and climate action. The CVA will work with other agencies and partners to coordinate opportunities, share information with local populations, recruit volunteers to support events and to promote the events with internal and external audiences. This is an opportunity for strategic coordination in working in a robust partnership atmosphere for community engagement. The CVA will:

- Work with youth program initiatives to recruit youth from local community for participation
- Work with other NPS units to coordinate opportunities

Position Responsibilities:

CVA's responsibilities include:

- Coordinate and understand of all the partners and opportunities in both communities.
- Represent the NPS in work with other agencies and partners to

- Recruit volunteers to support events and to promote the events with internal and external audiences.
- Represent the NPS to perform strategic coordination of community initiatives with federal, state and local agencies in Springfield and Hartford.

CVA Minimum Requirements:

- Communication skills to attend meetings, represent NPS, share notes
- Motivated and able to identify opportunities in creative ways to bring groups together.

- Be a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident
- Be 18-30 years old at time of service (veterans up to 35 years old)

- Be able to provide proof of a driver's license and complete a MVR check
 - Must be over 21 years old or have had license for at least 3 years to be insured in this position.
- Pass fingerprint-based FBI, state criminal, and a national sex offender checks.
- Have reliable form of transportation.

- Comfortable staffing a booth for events
- Organizational skills
- Experience engaging the public

- CVA will receive a weekly stipend of \$500 (additional \$65/week, if housing is not provided)
- Limited health care/childcare benefits
- The position is eligible for an AmeriCorps Education Award \$6,495.00 (pre-tax) upon successful completion of the program
- Professional development funds
- Networking opportunities within the National Park Service and partnering organizations
- Public Land Corps Hiring Authority
- Week-long in-person training at NPS site with travel/meal expenses covered.
